Archer Fleet Transition

The Student Aviation Advisory Council talked with Mr. Dick Schultz, Director of Flight Operations, to see how the Archer fleet transition is going for UND. Overall Mr. Schultz reported the fleet transition has been going well.

Where are the 172s going?

Many of them are headed south to UND Phoenix. The rest are either being sold or leased to different parties across the country. There are currently 28 172s left.

When will the transition be complete?

With numbers changing its hard to put a exact date on the final Archer being delivered to UND. UND currently has 46 Archers with 24 more on order. The next big delivery will occur in April and continue through August 2019.

How does the Archer compare to the 172 in terms of reliability?

As the fleet has matured the Archer fleet is matching the 172 in terms of dispatch reliability.

What flight courses will be using the 172 moving forward?

Starting in the spring the only flight course to be using the 172 will be 414. All undergraduates will be using the Archer starting in the Fall of 2019.

I was admitted to an Aviation program for Summer 2019 and am from a WUE, MSEP or Contiguous state. Will I be grandfathered?

Yes, declared Aviation students admitted for Summer 2019 (or earlier) will be classified as WUE, MSEP or Contiguous and will continue to be billed at those rates.
